

Gospel Mt 15:21-28 Woman, you have great faith.

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. 'Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs.' She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table.' Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.

The overarching theme derived from today's readings is the question of insider-outsider. We see here that the divisions and barriers that emerge out of human experience have been shattered by the graciousness of God. Jesus' openness to 'the other' finds a precedent in the prophetic tradition. Isaiah spoke of a time when outsiders would join insiders in worshipping God, thus dissolving the categories of insider and outsider. He was, of course, referring to the age of eschatological fulfilment. This age dawned with the coming of Jesus. Jesus himself moved out of the constraints of his own cultural worldview, and he directs us to do the same. People are either excluded because of gender, culture or religious perspective, or included only because they are able and willing to conform to discriminatory standards. In the reign of God, this should not be the case. People are accepted along with their own cultural profiles.

God's embrace first enclosed even those who rejected Jesus, and then God's plan of salvation unfolded in a new way. An invitation to enter the kingdom was issued to the Gentiles. those who had been considered outsiders. If outsiders are now insiders. what has happened to the former insiders? Paul insists that they are still insiders. God has not simply shifted the identifying boundaries; God has dissolved them. In the interim between the dawning of the eschatological age and the end of time, the invitation to be included remains open to all.

First Reading Is 56:1.6-7

I will lead the foreigners to my holy mountain.

Thus says the Lord: Have a care for justice. act with integrity, for soon my salvation will come and my integrity be manifest.

Foreigners who have attached themselves to the Lord to serve him and to love his name and be his servants – all who observe the sabbath, not profaning it, and cling to my covenant – these I will bring to my holy mountain. Since their rejection meant the reconciliation of the world, do you know what their admission will mean? Nothing less than a resurrection from the dead! God never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice.

Just as you changed from being disobedient to God, and now enjoy mercy because of their disobedience, so those who are disobedient now - and only because of the mercy shown to you - will also enjoy mercy eventually. God has imprisoned all men in their own disobedience only to show mercy to all mankind.


PARISH CENTRE Last Wednesday another meeting with Leaf Architecture took place. The quotes from two Surveying companies and two Town Planning companies should be available this coming week. At the moment it looks like the earliest time for Survey is in October. We are hoping for an earlier term. Once the Surveyor provides the data, which shouldn't take more than two weeks after survey, a Spatial Sketch of the

design can be produced which will be forwarded to the Archdiocese for approval. Any further action will depend on the response from the Archdiocese.

OPPORTUNITY TO DONATE - At our Parish Pastoral Council Meeting a decision was made that the requests to honour our founding parishioners are best fulfilled through an "active" choice rather than a 'passive" choice, which would inevitably lead to divisions and complaints (Why him and not her). An "active" choice is through a donation for a church item which would bear the name of the person honoured. Eight new vestments, Thurible + stand, six candlesticks, celebrant's table (next to the celebrant's chair) and a new church laptop (to assist with PowerPoint presentation, were added recently to our church items collection. All these new items are available for a donation. The inscription such as "Please pray for ..." or similar will be sown on the vestments or inscribed on other items. The items will be reserved for donation on first come first serve basis. The life expectancy of a vestment is up to 20 years, candlesticks 100+ years, Thurible 10+ years, Thurible stand 100+ years. The candlesticks are offered on individual basis, which means that each candlestick will have an inscription. Of course the reason for a donation does not have to be only honouring and remembering of a founding parishioner, but also could be remembering of any of your deceased loved ones, or remembering the donor him/herself. The "remembering" refers to the celebration of the Sacrifice of the Holy Mass for the repose of the soul of the deceased or blessing for the living. Each Sunday the Parish Priest celebrates one Mass for the welfare of the parishioners living and dead including all donors. 100% tax deduction is available. Please see Fr. Peter for the cost and/or reservation of the items and information on tax deduction.
