

Gospel Mt 16:13-20

You are Peter, to you I will give the keys of the kingdom of heaven.

When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?' And they said, 'Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he said 'who do you say I am?' Then Simon Peter spoke up, 'You are the Christ,' he said, 'the Son of the living God.' Jesus replied, 'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.

Reflection by Greg Sunter

Like last week's gospel, this week's story takes place in a region that was outside predominantly Jewish territory. Caesarea Philippi (north of Galilee and in the region of modern day Syria) had long been a center of pagan worship. It was used originally by the Canaanites as a site of worship; the Greeks built a temple to one of their gods there; in 20 BCE Herod the Great built a temple to Caesar Augustus; and after his death, Herod's son, Phillip, renamed the city Caesarea Phillipi after Tiberius Caesar and himself. It is intriguing that Matthew's gospel chooses such a site as the location for such a significant revelation of faith.

Jesus asks the disciples who people say he is. They report that people associate Jesus with one of the great prophets of Jewish tradition. By people identifying Jesus with other great prophets they were projecting Jesus into the same mold as that prophet. What they were saying was that Jesus will be a great leader in the style of John the Baptist, or Elijah, or even Jeremiah. The expectation of a messiah was running very high at the time of Jesus and everyone had their own idea about what that messiah would be like-usually aligned with some previous leader. They didn't seem to understand that Jesus was breaking the mold and was not going to fit in with any of those expectations. To see him as one of the great prophets come again is always going to be an inadequate understanding of Jesus as messiah.

When Jesus pushes the disciples for their own ideas, it is Simon Peter who speaks up and identifies Jesus as being the Son of the living God. Making a play on Peter's name (in Greek, petros = Peter and petra = rock). Jesus states that hereafter, Simon Peter will be known as Peter and upon the rock of his profession of faith the church will be built.

I place the key of the House of David upon his shoulder.

Thus says the Lord of hosts to Shebna, the master of the palace: I dismiss you from your office, I remove you from your post, and the same day I call on my servant Eliakim son of Hilkiah. I invest him with your robe, gird him with your sash, entrust him with your authority; and he shall be a father to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and to the House of Judah. I place the key of the House of David on his shoulder; should he open, no one shall close, should he close, no one shall open. I drive him like a peg into a firm place; he will become a throne of glory for his father's house.

FATHER'S DAY APPEAL – 3 **SEPTEMBER 2023**

Every year our Archdiocese conducts the Father's Day Appeal to assist our retired priests who have served us so faithfully. The 2023 Father's Day collection takes place on Sunday 3 September. We are indebted to our

priests. When they retire usually at age 75, often after giving fifty years or more of service, they are no longer supported by a Parish. It then becomes our duty to look after our priests in respect of their years of selfless service to generations of our families. While retired priests will receive a government pension, and/or superannuation income, most will require support with their accommodation needs, once they move from a parish presbytery. Renting or jointly purchasing a property is the primary demand on PRF funds. Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP has generously agreed the Archdiocese will match every donation two-to-one. For example, if the parish raises \$9,500, the Archdiocese will add another \$19,000.


PLANNED GIVING ENVELOPES

The new envelopes have been received and are available at the back

of the church. We invite all parishioners that would like to be included in the planned giving register to contact the Parish office to arrange a box of envelopes. Up to 30% of your Planned Giving is tax-deductible. Thank you for your contributions which are absolutely necessary for keeping our church doors open. May God reward you hundredfold.

PARISH CENTRE Our parish has appointed surveyor LTS Lockley (taking precise dimension and elevation of the building site), landscape designer GROUND Ink (design of the parish center building, the church foyer and visual harmonization), planner PLANNING PLUS (producing Statement of Environmental Effects needed for Development Application (DA) submission to the council), Michael Frost & Associates (producing Stormwater Concept Design needed for DA submission) and reappointed Leaf Architecture as our architect (to produce drawings for the builder). The surveyor should start the work this coming Tuesday.

OPPORTUNITY TO DONATE - At our Parish Pastoral Council Meeting a decision was made that the requests to honour our founding parishioners are best fulfilled through an "active" choice rather than a "passive" choice, which would inevitably lead to divisions and complaints (Why him and not her). An "active" choice is through a donation for a church item which would bear the name of the person honoured. Eight new vestments, Thurible + stand, six candlesticks, celebrant's table (next to the celebrant's chair) and a new church laptop (to assist with PowerPoint presentation, were added recently to our church items collection. All these new items are available for a donation. The inscription such as "Please pray for ..." or similar will be sown on the vestments or inscribed on other items. The items will be reserved for donation on first come first serve basis. The life expectancy of a vestment is up to 20 years, candlesticks 100+ years, Thurible 10+ years, Thurible stand 100+ years. The candlesticks are offered on individual basis, which means that each candlestick will have an inscription. Of course the reason for a donation does not have to be only honouring and remembering of a founding parishioner, but also could be remembering of any of your deceased loved ones, or remembering the donor him/herself. The "remembering" refers to the celebration of the Sacrifice of the Holy Mass for the repose of the soul of the deceased or blessing for the living. Each Sunday the Parish Priest celebrates one Mass for the welfare of the
