

#### Gospel Mt 16:21-27

Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself.

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside. Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me. Satan! You are an obstacle in my path. because the way you think is not God's way but man's.'

Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?

'For the Son of Man is going to come in the glory of his Father with his angels, and, when he does, he will reward each one according to his behaviour.'

### **Reflection** by Greg Sunter

This week's gospel is the first of three predictions of Jesus' death and resurrection in Matthew's gospel (see also Mark and Luke). Despite Peter's confession of faith that immediately precedes this passage (see last week's gospel), the disciples still do not have a very solid understanding of Jesus' purpose. They may regard him as the Messiah, but still do not fully understand what that means. In this passage, Jesus is beginning to prepare them for the events of the passion – his death and resurrection. He is trying to lead them to a greater understanding of his mission and message. But Peter abruptly 'rebukes' Jesus and tells him not to speak like that. One can almost hear Peter saving, 'Look, Jesus, you've got a good thing going here, don't spoil it by talking about dying!' However, Jesus responds to Peter very sharply, suggesting that his lack of understanding is inspired by evil and reflects human thought, not divine wisdom.

The passage then leads in to a description of the challenge of discipleship. To be a follower of Jesus means to 'deny' oneself, take up one's cross and follow Jesus. In the context of this passage, to 'deny' oneself means to not be concerned about 'I' but to be concerned about 'You' - to put others before self. To be a follower of Jesus means to be selfless, not self-centred. In the ultimate example of this, Jesus tells his disciples that whoever wishes to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for Jesus' sake will find it. To 'save' your life is to hold back from giving yourself fully to the message of Jesus - to be 'halfhearted' in your faith. But to 'lose' yourself in the message of Jesus is to fully give yourself over to living the reign of God and through 'losing' yourself in this way, Jesus tells us, is how to truly find life.

May you present your bodies as a living sacrifice.

Do not model yourselves on the behaviour of the world around you, but let your behaviour change, modelled by your new mind. #### FATHER'S DAY APPEAL - 3 **SEPTEMBER 2023**

Every year our Archdiocese conducts the Father's Day Appeal to assist our retired priests who have served us so faithfully. The 2023 Father's Day collection takes place on Sunday 3 September. We are indebted to our priests. When they retire usually at age 75, often after giving fifty years or more of service, they are no longer supported by a Parish. It then becomes our duty to look after our priests in respect of their years of selfless service to generations of our families. While retired priests will receive a government pension, and/or superannuation income, most will require support with their accommodation needs, once they move from a parish presbytery. Renting or jointly purchasing a property is the primary demand on PRF funds. Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP has generously agreed the Archdiocese will match every

donation two-to-one. For example, if the parish raises \$9,500, the Archdiocese will add another \$19,000.


