# Gospel Mk 1:1-8

Make straight the paths of the Lord.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you;

he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight,

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

# Reflection by Fr Michael Tate

John immersed, baptised, his followers in water, symbolising the washing away of the sins of the past. But he could not empower people by drenching them in the dynamic life of God. John anticipates 'Someone' (not named!) who does have the power to inundate, baptise, people with the Holy Spirit.

From the heading of St Mark's Gospel, we know that that 'Someone' is 'Jesus Christ, Son of God' who came to flood our lives with that Divine Power which can effect a completely new *future* for humanity.

That is why St Mark took the term 'gospel' (good news) which was used on inscriptions announcing an Emperor's birth or victory, and used it to describe his inspired rendering of the mission of Jesus Christ, which was to inaugurate the 'Kingdom of God', overcoming the pretensions of all Emperors of any kind throughout history.

We could pause for a moment to thank God for the Good News of our being baptised with *water* in the 'Name of the Father and of the Son and of the *Holy Spirit.*'

# Second Reading 2 Pt 3:8-14

We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

CHRISTMAS RECONCILIATION this year we will join the Vietnamese community on Wednesday 13th December at 7pm. There will be a number of visiting priests and the reconciliation should take not more than half an hour.

### **CHRISTMAS MASS TIMES**

This year the Christmas falls on Monday 25th December, which means that the Christmas Vigil and the Christmas Mass of the Night will take place on Sunday 24th December. Please note that to fulfill the Sunday Mass Obligation and the Holy Day of Obligation (Christmas) one needs to attend the proper 4th Sunday of Advent Mass and the proper Christmas Mass. The 4th Sunday of Advent Mass times will be as usual: the Saturday Vigil at 5pm and Sunday morning at 8.00am and 10.00am. The Christmas Mass times will be as follows. Christmas Vigil Sunday 24 December at 5.00pm, this will be Children's Mass. The Christmas Mass of the Night (also colloquially known as the Midnight Mass) will take place at 8.00pm. The Christmas Dawn and Christmas Day Mass will take place on Monday 25 December at 8.00am and 10.00am respectively. One fulfills the Christmas Holy Day of Obligation by attending any one of the four Christmas Masses. Of course if you attend 2 Masses on one day, you can receive Holy Communion at both Masses.
