

## Gospel Mk 1:14-20

Repent, and believe the Good News.

After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'

As he was walking along by the Sea of Galilee he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net in the lake - for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you into fishers of men.' And at once they left their nets and followed him.

Going on a little further, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they too were in their boat, mending their nets. He called them at once and, leaving their father Zebedee in the boat with the men he employed, they went after him.

# Reflection by Dianne Bergant CSA

Today we reflect on the first and most important responsibility of discipleship, namely, evangelisation, the goal of which is the proclamation of the reign of God. God seems to choose the most unlikely people to preach to others. It does not matter who *brings* the good news, but who *receives* it. Jonah the prophet was sent to outsiders, even enemies. The disciples were fishermen who spoke to the people of their own country. God's salvation is intended for all, and it seems to make little difference who brings this good news.

Today's readings call for repentance. The grace of God requires a new way of living, a life of faith and commitment. The gospel invites us into the age of fulfilment, a salvific reign of truth, compassion and kindness. It is a way of life that leads to justice.

There is an urgency in these readings. This world in its present form is passing away, and God's call demands a total response. Like the disciples, we must leave the familiarity of our former ways and follow the call that we have heard in the depths of our hearts. We are called first to enter the reign of God and then to spread it. As ambassadors of God, we bring the good news of salvation wherever we are and in whatever we do. Called by God, we now begin to live in a totally different way, guided by the values of the reign of God rather than those of the world that is passing away.

# First Reading Jon 3:1-5. 10

The Ninevites renounced their evil ways.

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it. Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least.

God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

## **HOW ARE YOUR DONATIONS**

USED? There are two collections every week. 1st collection goes towards utilities of the parish house (gas, water, electricity), housekeeping, priest's food and stipend (approx. \$18,000 pa), superannuation and stipends for supplying priests. There is no tax deduction on the 1st collection. Donations towards the expenses covered by the 1st collection are normally done by

cash on a weekly basis. 2nd collection goes towards the insurance, maintenance, utilities of the church, church supplies, secretary's and other parish staffs' wages, catechetical expenses, and any other general expenses with running a parish. This year we can claim 30% tax deduction on our 2nd collection (30% goes to Charitable Works Fund Trust [CWFT] which is Deductible Gift Recipient [DGR] entity; the Diocese then donates to the parish the same amount every 3 months) A Tax Receipt that enables you to claim 30% tax deduction is issued at the end of the financial year.

#### DIFFERENT WAYS OF MAKING A DONATION

CASH—simply place on the collection plate. First plate goes towards the 1st collection expenses and 2nd plate towards the second collection expenses. Disadvantage of this way of making a donation is that the parish doesn't know who donated the money and therefore cannot offer a Tax Donation Receipt.

TAP DEVICES—at the entrance of the church. Simply place you credit or debit card or any configured device with Near Field Communication (NFC) technology such as your mobile phone or your watch to the vicinity of these Tap Device (approximately 1cm) and wait for a beep and a greet tick symbol. If a red X signal is displayed, the transaction was unsuccessful and you need to try again. These devices are set to \$10. If you'd like to donate more than \$10 swipe again after the first donation was acknowledged. The advantage of Tap Devices is that it offers a contactless way of making a donation with no need to handle money. The disadvantage is the same as with Cash donation, it is an anonymous donation and the Parish will not be able to issue a Tax Donation Receipt.

MONTHLY CREDIT/DEBIT CARD—once a month your donation is processed directly via your credit/debit card. Please bear in mind that this is a donation for the full month, so if your intention is to make \$10 donation each week, you

need to configure your monthly donation to 10x52/12 (\$43.33). The advantage of this form of making a donation is that once setup, you do not need to worry to bring cash or card to the church, there is no handling of money and you will be issued a Tax Donation Receipt at the end of the year. Also if you are away from the parish you still continue to support your parish. Please contact our secretary to register. PLAN GIVING—a set of 52 of dated envelopes is issued at the beginning of the financial year. You place your donation in cash inside the envelope and place it on the 2nd collection plate. The advantage is that you will be issued a Tax Deductible Receipt. Of course if you are away from the parish you can place multiple envelopes on the plate once you return. Please contact our secretary to register. There is no set amount for donations. Each of us contributes according to our personal financial means. A rule of thumb for those who work is one hour wage. From the counting and recording point of view the most convenient form of donation is the monthly credit/debit card donation. If you have a choice please avoid coin donations as these can add up to a considerable weight which is difficult and dangerous to handle.

SAFEGUARDING OUR PARISH - Child sexual abuse is a crime. The appropriate people to deal with crimes are the police. If you, or anyone you know, have been abused, please contact the police. 
