these branches are collected and thrown on the fire,

and they are burnt.

If you remain in me

and my words remain in you,

you may ask what you will

and you shall get it.

It is to the glory of my Father that you should bear much fruit,

and then you will be my disciples.'

Reflection by Greg Sunter

The Lectionary of this Easter season draws out some of the 'classic' gospel passages, particularly some of the discourses from the Gospel of John. Like many 'famous' or familiar passages, it can be true that familiarity breeds contempt – we think we are so familiar with the passage that we don't need to pay it much attention.

At first glance, it appears that there is a certain ruthlessness about the image of the vinedresser pruning the vine: perform or perish! However, the process of cutting away and pruning branches is an incredibly nurturing action; it is removing the unproductive portions of the plant so that the vine has an even better opportunity to produce fruit in the next season. It an act of love; not an act of economic rationalism. Within our own lives we are called to make decisions about which of our thoughts and actions are life-giving (fruit-bearing) and which are unproductive; negative; crippling; life-diminishing. If we are able to 'prune' our life-diminishing thoughts and actions we allow ourselves the freedom and the ability to really flourish. Feelings of jealousy, greed, resentment, self-doubt and lack of confidence can limit our ability to be fully alive just as addictive and harmful behaviours can physically take away our ability to perform at our best.

I am reminded of the old *Karate Kid* movie when the boy, Daniel, is introduced to the art of bonsai. He is told to close his eyes, imagine the perfect tree and then start clipping and shaping the plant to make real the perfection that lies within it. It is only through a process of cutting away and pruning that we can nurture ourselves to realise the beauty of our potential.

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The Living Word

Fifth Sunday of Easter, Year B

First Reading Acts 9:26-31

He explained how the Lord appeared to Saul and spoke to him on his journey.

When Saul got to Jerusalem he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him: they could not believe he was really a disciple. Barnabas, however, took charge of him, introduced him to the apostles, and explained how the Lord had appeared to Saul and spoken to him on his journey, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus. Saul now started to go round with them in Jerusalem, preaching fearlessly in the name of the Lord. But after he had spoken to the Hellenists, and argued with them, they became determined to kill him. When the brothers knew, they took him to Caesarea, and sent him off from there to Tarsus.

The churches throughout Judaea, Galilee and Samaria were now left in peace, building themselves up, living in the fear of the Lord, and filled with the consolation of the Holy Spirit.

MESSAGE FROM FR PETER

On Monday 22nd April I have received an email with message of resignation from our 8am organist, our 5pm vigil organist and our 5pm cantor and conductor. No reason for the resignation was given, however, it followed my email outlining my vision for the music ministry in our parish which is the same as the vision of Australian Bishops' Conference, the implementation of which would necessitate a process of transition from the current list of music to the one selected/approved by the bishops. Over the years the list of music used in Georges Hall has evolved in its own way, separate from the rest of Australia. This is a conversation which we had to have and is long overdue. I want to acknowledge with gratitude the hard work of our musicians over many years in the past. The door is always open for them whenever they are ready to continue in the music ministry.

BIG SHOES TO FILL With the above mentioned resignations there are big shoes left to be filled. Any parishioners willing to help with either playing the organ or singing, please let Fr. Peter know. The invitation is also extended to our young parishioners/children learning piano/organ to come forward. All

training will be provided. Ideally we would have a number of organists for each Mass forming a roster and filling for one another in time of sickness, or travel. In the meantime Mr. James Doig, who filled in at 10.00am Mass last week will also help with the 8am Mass, subject to his availability. He is an accomplished and qualified musician, both organist and cantor and will soon schedule a choir practice for those interested. Please pray for our parish music ministry so that this crisis may turn into a catalyst for renewal and provision for the future.
